Student Requirements:

1. Must be 16 years of age or older before the start of the course.
2. Hold a VAOEMS approved cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) course at the beginning date and throughout the course. (CCJA offers free Health Care Provider / Professional Rescuer CPR training for enrolled students the day prior to the course).

Required Material: American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons (AAOS), Emergency Care and Transportation of the Sick and Injured, **Twelfth Edition** and Navigate 2 Premier Access Required.

The student must have the Premier Package through Public Safety Group **by the first day of class**. CCJA students receive a 30% discount code upon enrollment.

***A laptop or computer access is required during this course to complete assignments and testing.**



Program Description:

Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) is a 4-year certification.

The Emergency Medical Technician course provides training to prepare an individual to independently function in a medical emergency. This course teaches the basic knowledge and skills required to provide basic life support (BLS) care, serves as a vital link in the chain of the health care team, and is required to progress to the more advanced levels of pre-hospital patient care.

All the necessary skills to provide emergency medical care as an attendant-in-charge with a basic life support ambulance service or other specialized rescue service are included in this course. Upon the successful completion of this training program, the student will be capable of performing the following functions:

1. Recognize the nature and seriousness of the patient's condition or extent of injury to assess the requirements for emergency care.
2. Administer appropriate emergency care to stabilize the patient's condition.
3. Lift, move, position and otherwise handle the patient in a way to minimize discomfort and further injury.

The EMT curriculum is based upon the National EMS Education Standards which have replaced the National Standard Curriculum (NSC) for all levels of EMS. Virginia has developed the "Virginia Education Standards" based primarily on the National EMS Education Standards.

This course requires ten (10) hours of clinical / field rotations which are included within this program.

Certification requires the successful completion of the Virginia psychomotor examination followed by the National Registry (NREMT) written examination. **State practical examinations are independently conducted off-site by Virginia Regional EMS Councils.**
